Other awards presented included the George Moore Award (Nash Rawiller), the Theo Green Award (Josh Adams) and the Sydney Strapper of the Year (Michael Doolan).

Another highlight of the evening was the keynote speech of the president of the St Vincent de Paul Society, Ray Reynolds, who thanked guests for their attendance and support of Vincentian House.

After the conclusion of the awards ceremony, Australia's favourite cabaret and Broadway performer David Campbell took to the stage as the feature artist for the evening.
