All American, a son of top sire, Red Ransom currently holds top pin.

A strong winner of the Skyline Stakes and runner up in the Blue Diamond Stakes, All American has the form on the board. Stable mate, Von Costa De Hero, who looks more of a miler, is currently at \$9.50.

This handsome son of Encosta De Lago is a winner of the prestigious VRC Sires Produce Stakes, but has not raced since then. Of Course, Von Costa De Lago is owned by the powerful Darley Group who of course have just bought Woodlands. Look out in the next couple of weeks as the NSWROA is doing a special story on this and getting views from leading “Racing Identities” on what impact this major change is going to have on Australian Racing.

Of the fillies the pride of South Australia, Augusta Proud (\$12.40) and the Victorian filly, Sugar Babe (\$11.50) look to hold the key for the fairer sex. Augusta Proud has certainly done no wrong and what a training performance it will be from Leon Macdonald if he can get the filly to the line. Six from six, not bad.

Whatever the result, we wish Alan Brown, Michael Kenny and all the directors of the STC the best of luck for their upcoming meetings and are quite sure it will be another huge success for them.

Just before we leave the Slipper, what an entrée it will be to the Slipper with the clash of
