

GENERAL NEWS

New Rules for Traceability of Thoroughbreds

Racing Australia has announced that from May 1, its new traceability rules will come into effect.

Their purpose is to enhance and broaden the traceability of racehorses throughout their lives, or during the time they are in the jurisdiction of the racing industry or relevant industry participants. It is expected that horse status and movements will be better tracked and, as a result, more positive welfare outcomes will occur.

The May 1 traceability rules affect breeding horses, unnamed horses not registered to race, named horses that are registered to race, retired horses, access to property and breach of traceability regulations.

They require industry participants to notify Racing Australia of things like change of ownership and location, retirement from racing or breeding, death and, finally, status update (notifying Racing Australia of a horse's circumstances if that horse has had no activity registered for six consecutive months).

The new rules have very specific timelines within which participants must notify Racing Australia.

For example, a breeder must notify the Australian Stud Book of a horse's death within 48 hours of the event, and lodge a Mare Return and Foal Ownership Declaration within 30 days of a foaling. Trainers are obligated to lodge a Stable Return immediately upon a named horse entering or leaving a yard, and owners of racing horses must lodge any transfers of ownership, or retirement decisions, within seven days of such a decision.

The new rules allow stewards to access properties for the purpose of assessing and observing the health and conditions of a horse on welfare grounds, and to bring along anyone that may assist in examining the health and welfare of a horse.

And, should industry participants breach the traceability rules, Racing Australia has made provisions for their restriction by way of either the Stud Book, a PRA or Racing Australia itself, and this includes inability of individuals to race and breed, or the withholding of prizemoney, including bonus schemes.

The ATC Heritage Centre Exhibitions

One of the rewarding activities the folks at the ATC Heritage Centre do is to show the ATC collection to the people.

The Heritage Centre itself is a showpiece and can be visited by appointment or on regular tours, to resume after Covid restrictions are eased. But the archivist and her team frequently prepare exhibits to be displayed at the ATC racecourses on racedays.



These are often in the form of showcases with labelled explanations of the items and sometimes include a spoken presentation and explanation of the exhibit. Also wall displays are used regularly to bring racing history to the fore.

On occasions there are larger exhibitions for special milestones or events or just to offer a view of the collection to the general public. One such exhibition was held in the Bowen Library at Maroubra in 2014 (*left*). It

was very well curated and received and showed many of the ATC's collection items to people not often exposed to the world of horse racing.

Turn the clock back to 2010 and it was the 200th Anniversary of Racing in NSW (in fact, Australia). With short notice the ATC Heritage Society and AJC employees presented for Racing NSW the largest exhibition of horse racing memorabilia ever displayed in Australia.

This writer certainly hasn't seen or heard of any display even approaching its size and scope. It was a one day only display on October 16 2010. There was the Governor of NSW – The Honourable Marie Bashir (*right*) opening the exhibition, with



dignitaries of the Government and Racing NSW present to enhance the occasion.





The exhibition was held in the majestic old Tea House (sadly lost now to the Theatre of the Horse) (*above*) to remember the moment. The size of the exhibition is shown by the two length-of-floor-space photos – one looking north and one south.



BOBS SCHEME UPDATE

Goulburn trainer Danny Williams unearthed a promising type in Ahead Start after the Dream Ahead (USA) gelding powered home to take out the TAB Highway at Royal Randwick on All Aged Stakes Day.

The race was even more special for Williams as it was named after fellow trainer Neville Layt who lost his battle with cancer the previous week.

"I was only talking to Neville a couple of weeks ago," Williams said. "My heart goes out to the Layt family."

Jockey James McDonald had to navigate an interrupted path on Ahead Start but once into the open, the three-yearold put the issue beyond doubt.

The win was Ahead Start's third victory in just four starts and along with his \$74,450 in prizemoney, the horse has also earned \$28,125 in BOBS bonuses.

Ahead Start had previously recorded wins at Wellington and Moruya.

Williams pointed out that Ahead Start was 'supposed to win': "He was in race 1, was number 11 and his raceday stall was 111!"

The trainer is now focusing on the \$1.3 million The Kosciuszko (1400m) at Randwick in the spring.

"The Kosciuszko is a long-term plan – I mentioned this to some of the owners at the end of last preparation that it is a goal on October 16.

"I wanted to run him in the Highway and perhaps give him one or more two starts then put him out for a break."


