HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

Racing Communications in a Bygone Era



Imagine, if you will, communication in Australia in 1893.

The telephone had been invented but it was in its early years and few were in operation and then only in local exchanges, no intrastate, interstate or international availability. If you needed to communicate with someone you either drove in your horse and cart to see them (no cars); sent them a letter; sent them a postcard; or if you could afford to, sent a telegram.

Most communication in the racing world for the conduct of race meetings was done in person or by telegram. Racing Club offices were the main venue of lodging entries, acceptances and advising scratchings, but for many it was by telegram. The typed or Morse Coded telegram was not yet in general operation so telegrams were lodged by hand at the post office. These were despatched by the fastest means available and hand-delivered to the recipients by "telegram boys".

In the ATC Heritage Collection there is a framed hand-written telegram sent by the connections of a horse named Trenchant, dated 18/9/93 at 10.20 a.m. (pictured). Sent by his trainer J Allsopp to his owner W Gardiner, the telegram was seeking instructions regarding the running of the horse. You will not be able to read it from this picture so I quote it as below:




"Trenchant only in handicaps if win one will receive more weight Melbourne Cup teeth very bad not eating well shall I run him or not"

As Trenchant, a three-year-old, had just won the AJC Derby at only his second start with bad teeth his prospects for the Melbourne Cup, a couple of months away, looked good. I can't help with the answer and the immediate ramifications of Mr Gardiner's decision, but I can tell you that Trenchant did run in Tarcoola's 1893 Melbourne Cup, finishing down the field.

Also in the ATC Heritage Collection is this framed picture of Trenchant, with a hand-coloured blue riband painted around his neck. Also within the frame is a part of his winning Derby riband adorning the photograph. It seems that this item was presented to the AJC some time after the

event by a relative of owner Mr W A Gardiner as the facts were not checked and the plaque caption on the bottom of the frame names the Derby winner as Trenton. Trenton was Trenchant's sire but the picture is not him, it is Trenchant.

Just a little red-herring to lead historians astray.



Trenchant won only the one black-type race – The AJC Derby. He went to stud but did not sire any horses of renown, although there were two stakes-winners among his progeny. Severity won a Caulfield Stakes and Retrencher won a Memsie Stakes. Both of these races are Group 1 rated today though would have been lesser rated at that time.


